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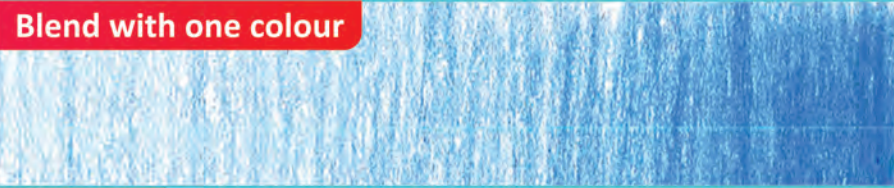
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Colouring Concept

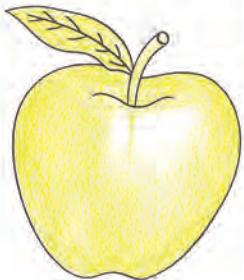

Step 1: Use a yellow crayon to colour this apple with top to bottom strokes as shown.



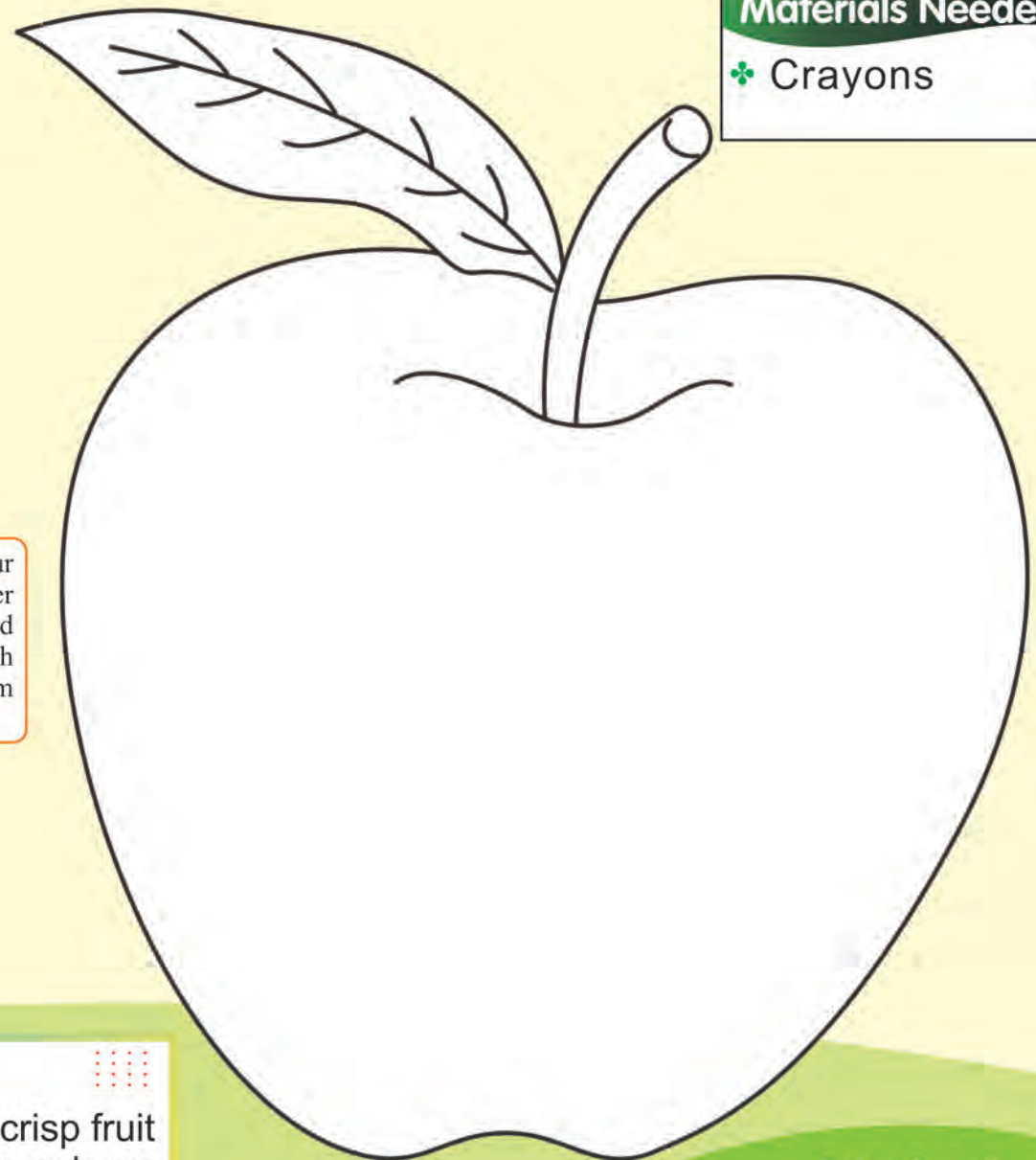
Step 2: Colour the next layer using red crayon with top to bottom strokes.



Step 3: Highlight with green crayon on the top and the leaf. Fill brown colour in the apple stick.

Step 1: Using a suitable brush, paint the mango using yellow water colour.



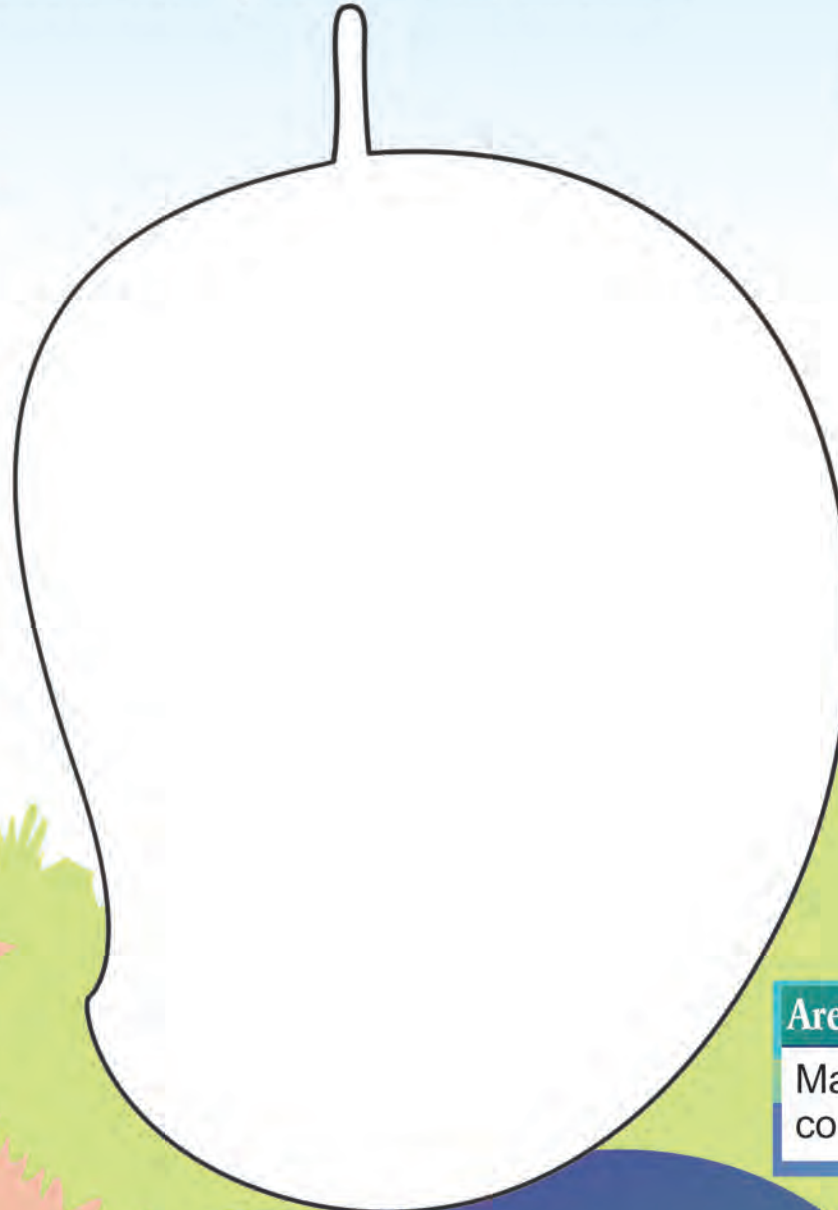
Step 2: Let it dry first. Now colour the mango using red water colour as shown.

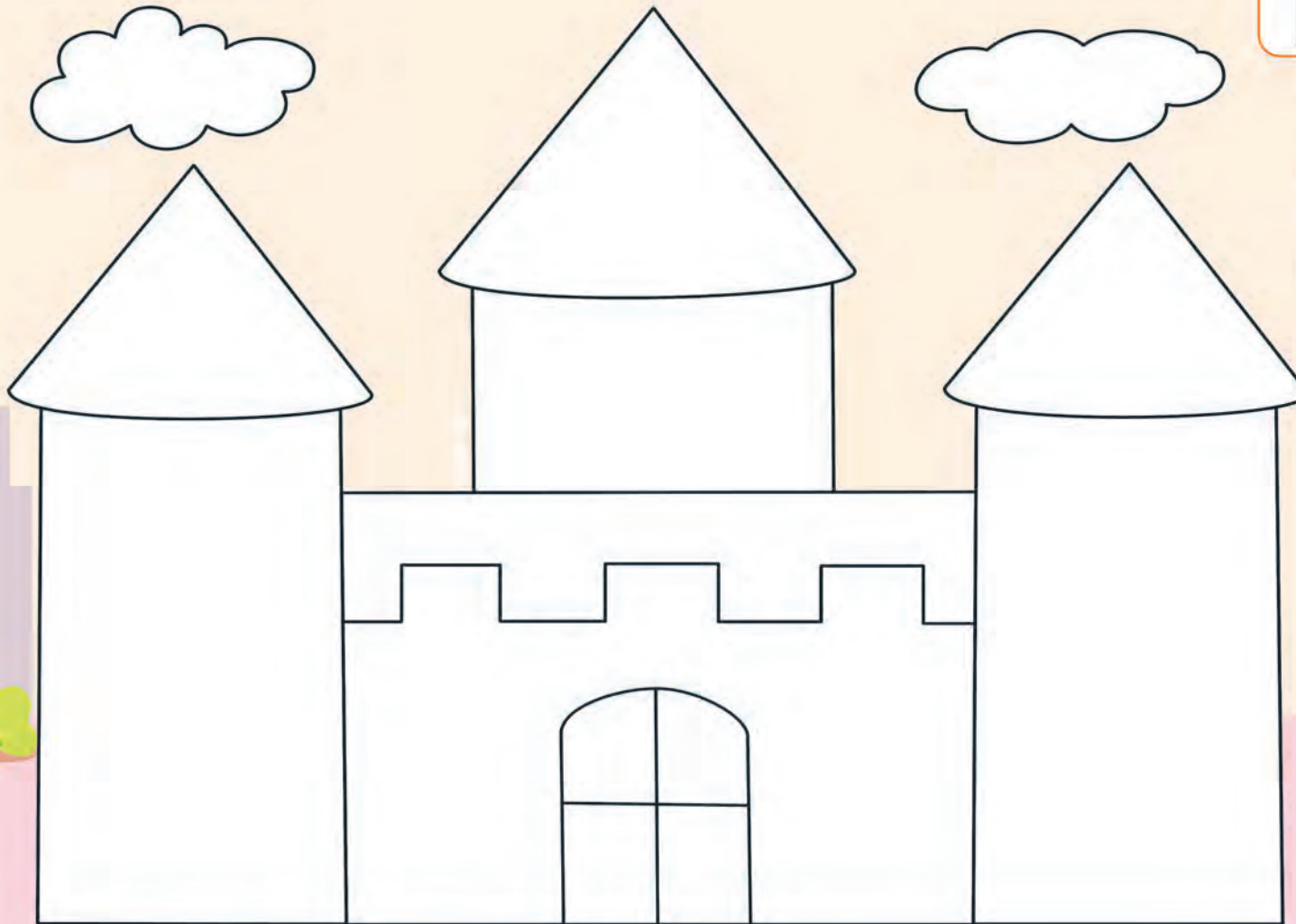

Pencil sketch looks very attractive because of the use of light and dark shades. These shadings can be of different tones.



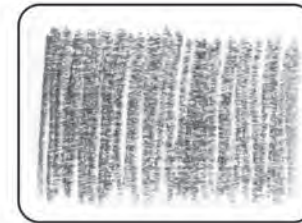

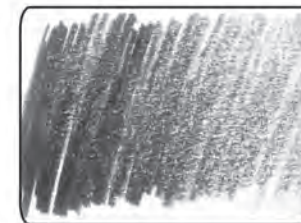

A crane is a type of tall wading bird. If the subject to be drawn is of white colour, use dark shades of colours in the background. Colour the background here and the crane using different pencil colours.

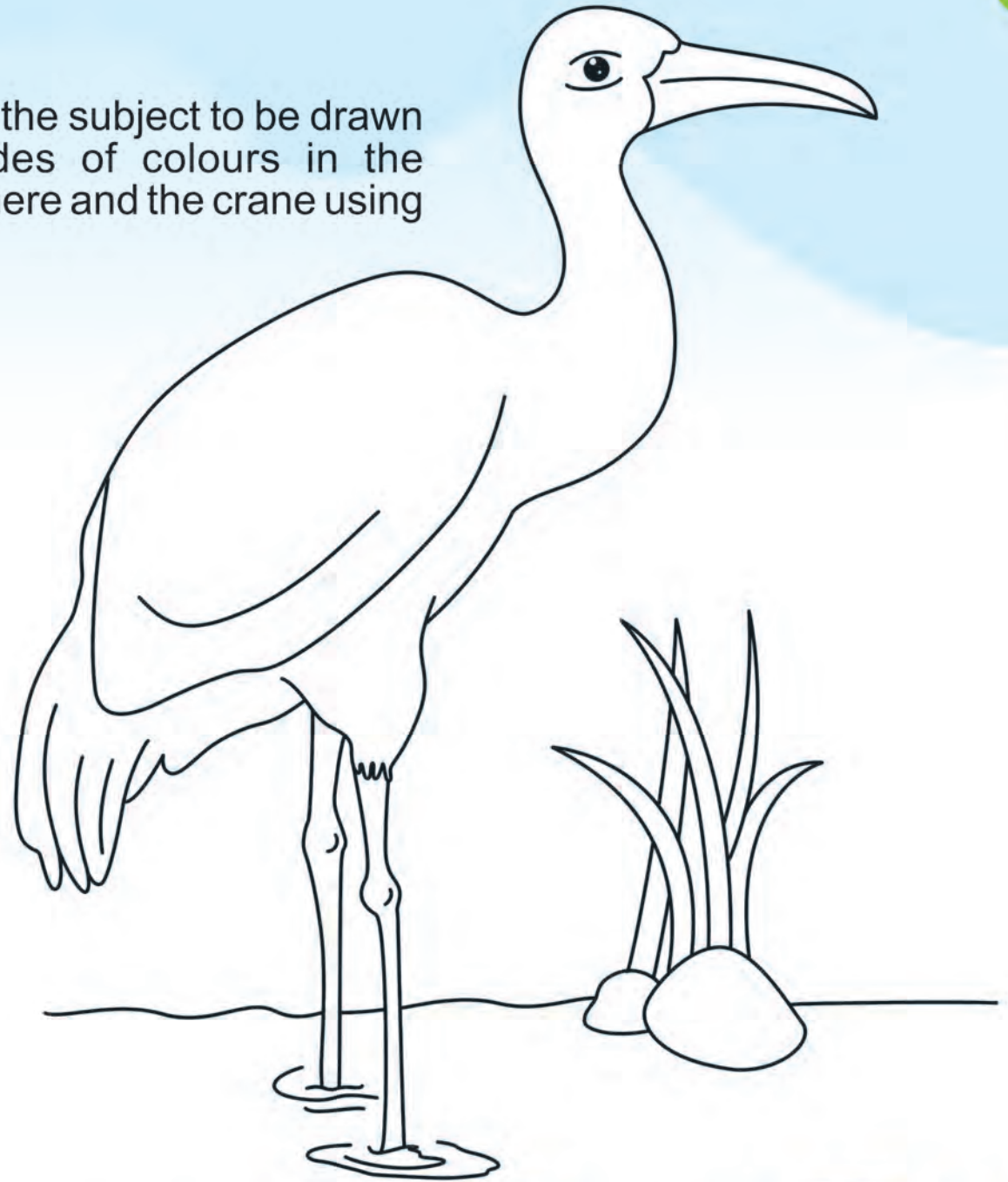

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Dolphins

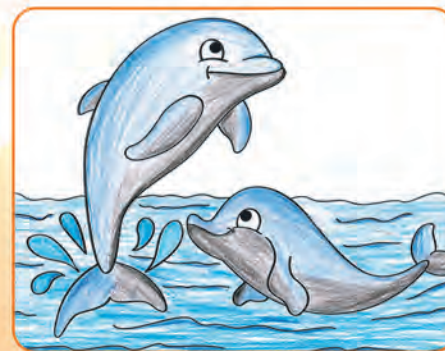
Look at the playful dolphins! Let's play with them by colouring these pictures using merging/blending techniques.

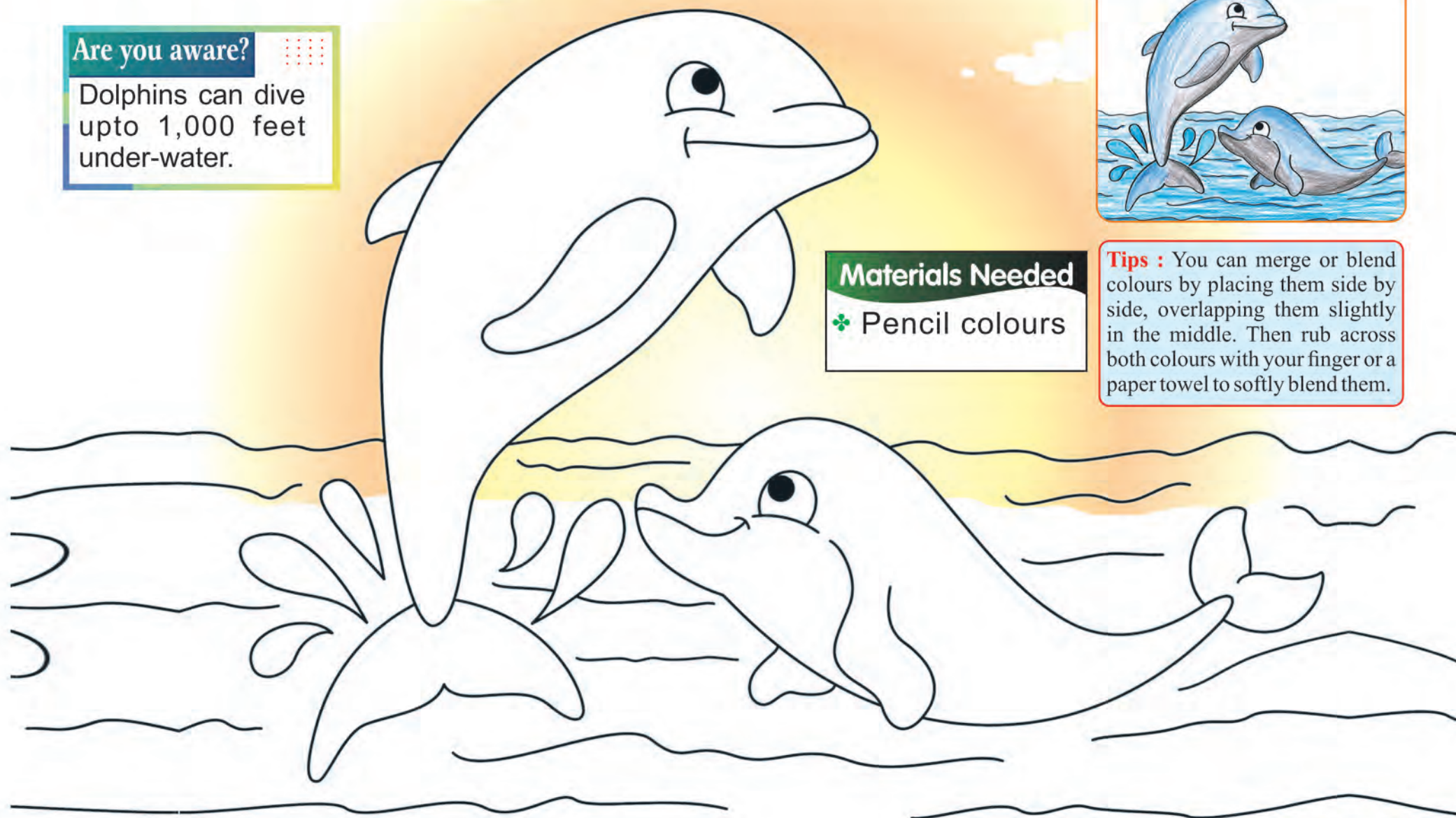
Dolphins can dive upto 1,000 feet under-water.

Tips : You can merge or blend colours by placing them side by side, overlapping them slightly in the middle. Then rub across both colours with your finger or a paper towel to softly blend them.



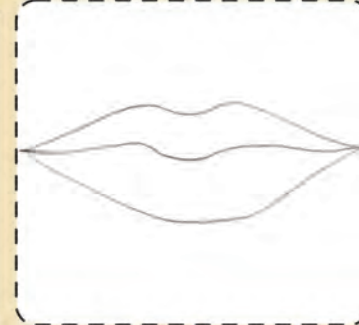
Eyes and Lips - Pencil Shading

The word 'resist' is used to describe the action in which two materials repel each other. In this piece of art, we are using wax and water colour to resist each other or repel. Follow the steps and make the dinosaur glow.

Are you aware?

Wax resist painting combines wax and watercolours to create layered effects, showcasing how different materials can interact artistically.

Step 1



Trace the lines using a golden or silver wax crayon applying some pressure for heavy strokes.

Step 2



Now paint **diluted black water colour** with flat brush over the picture.

Step 3



Look what appears as you start painting.

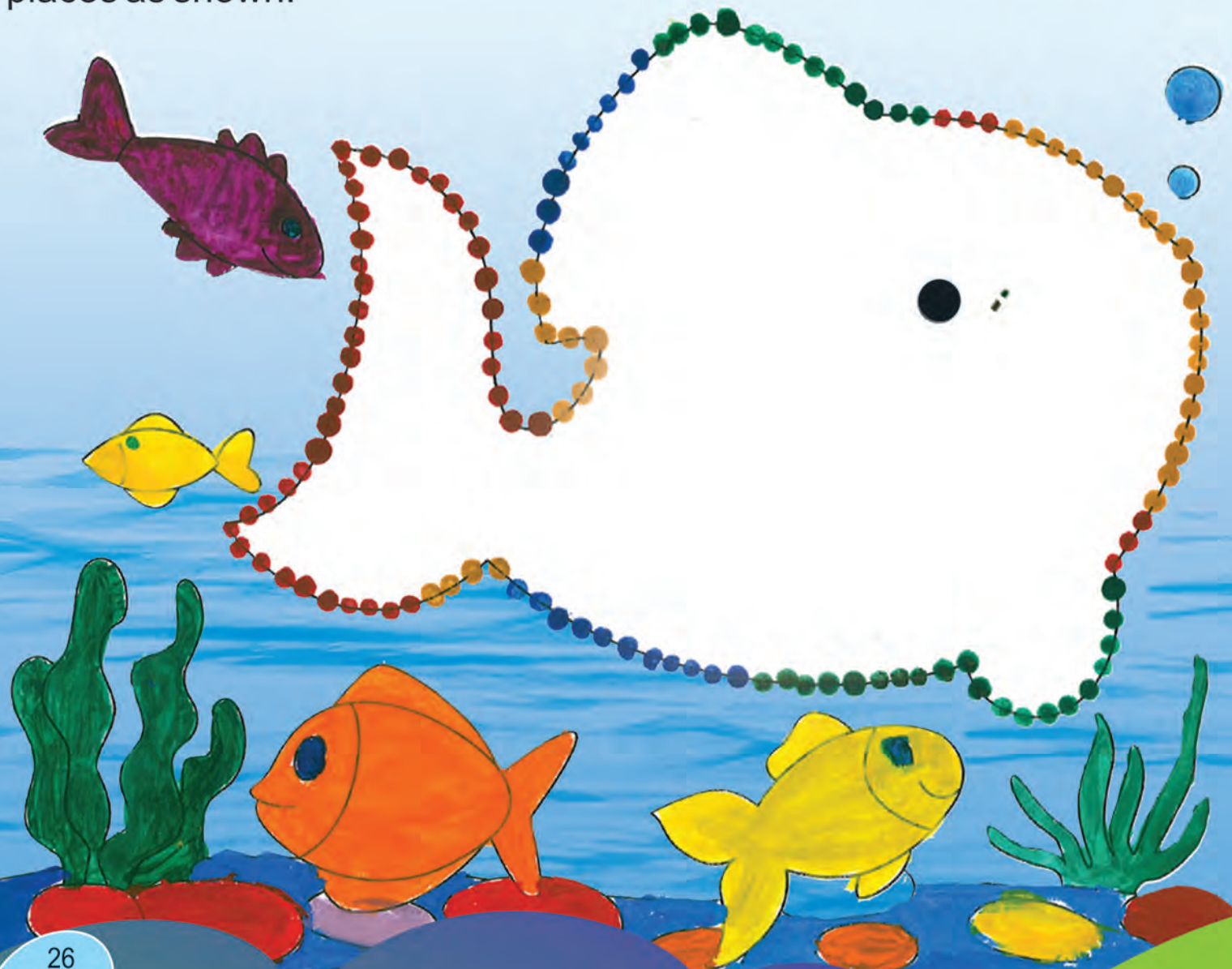
Fish - Ear-bud impressions

Step 1: Colour the background using water colours and draw the given sketch using black pencil colour.



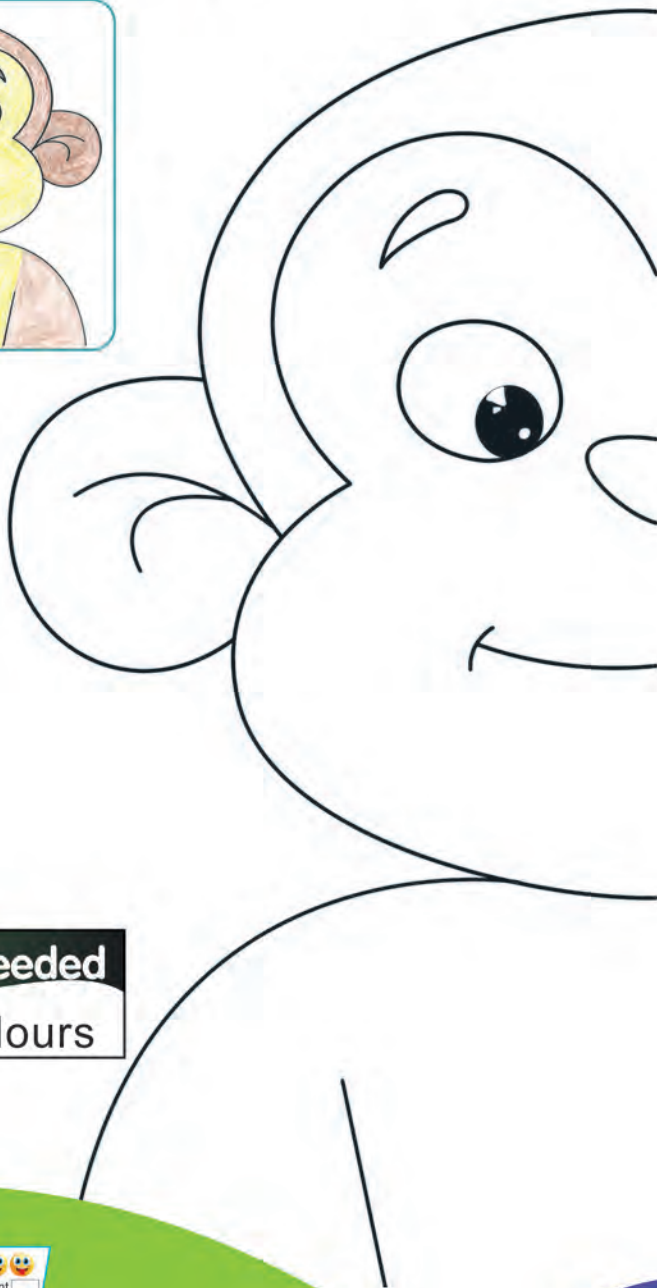
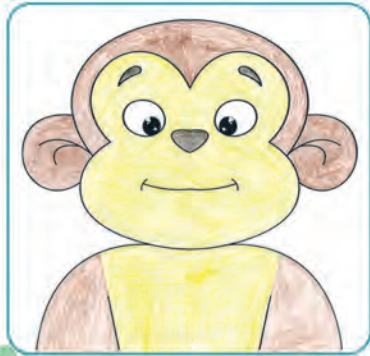
Step 2: Fill in the black poster colour to complete the Silhouette painting.

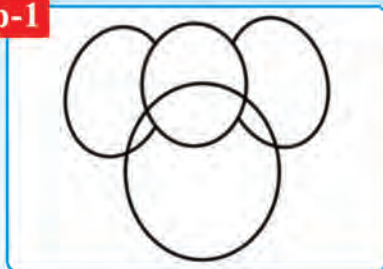

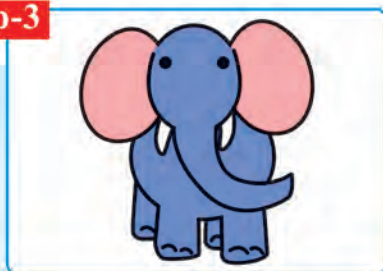

Thread Painting

Threads can be used to make amazing paintings. Follow the steps given and learn to draw beautiful designs and paintings using a simple thread.



Step 1: Apply two or three colours on the thread at intervals.



Step 2: Take a plain white sheet of paper and fold it from the centre. Keep this coloured thread inside the paper and fold it.



Step 3: Apply pressure with one hand. Holding the end of the thread, pull out a small length of the thread.



Step 4: Open the folded paper and carefully remove the thread.
