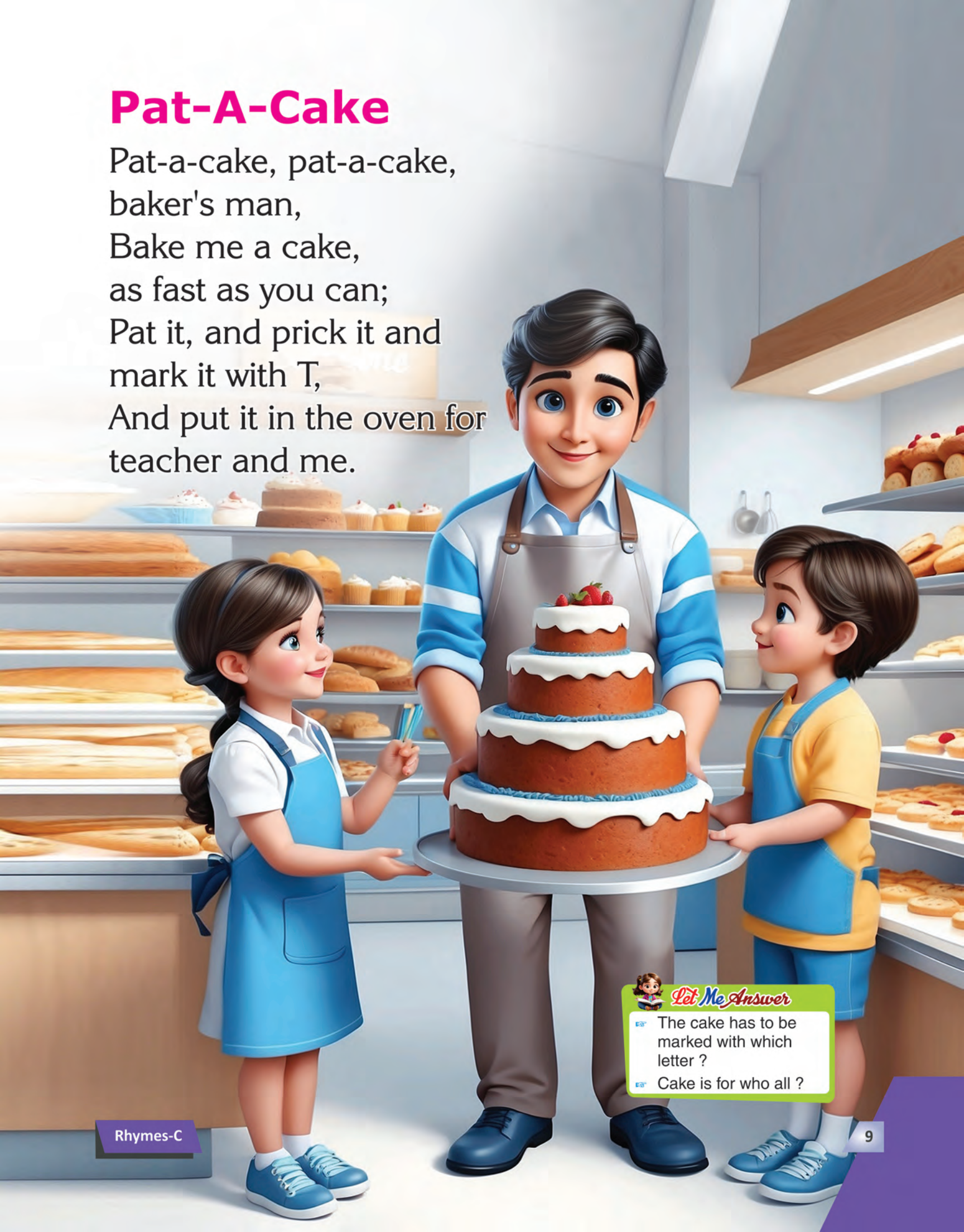

All through the town.

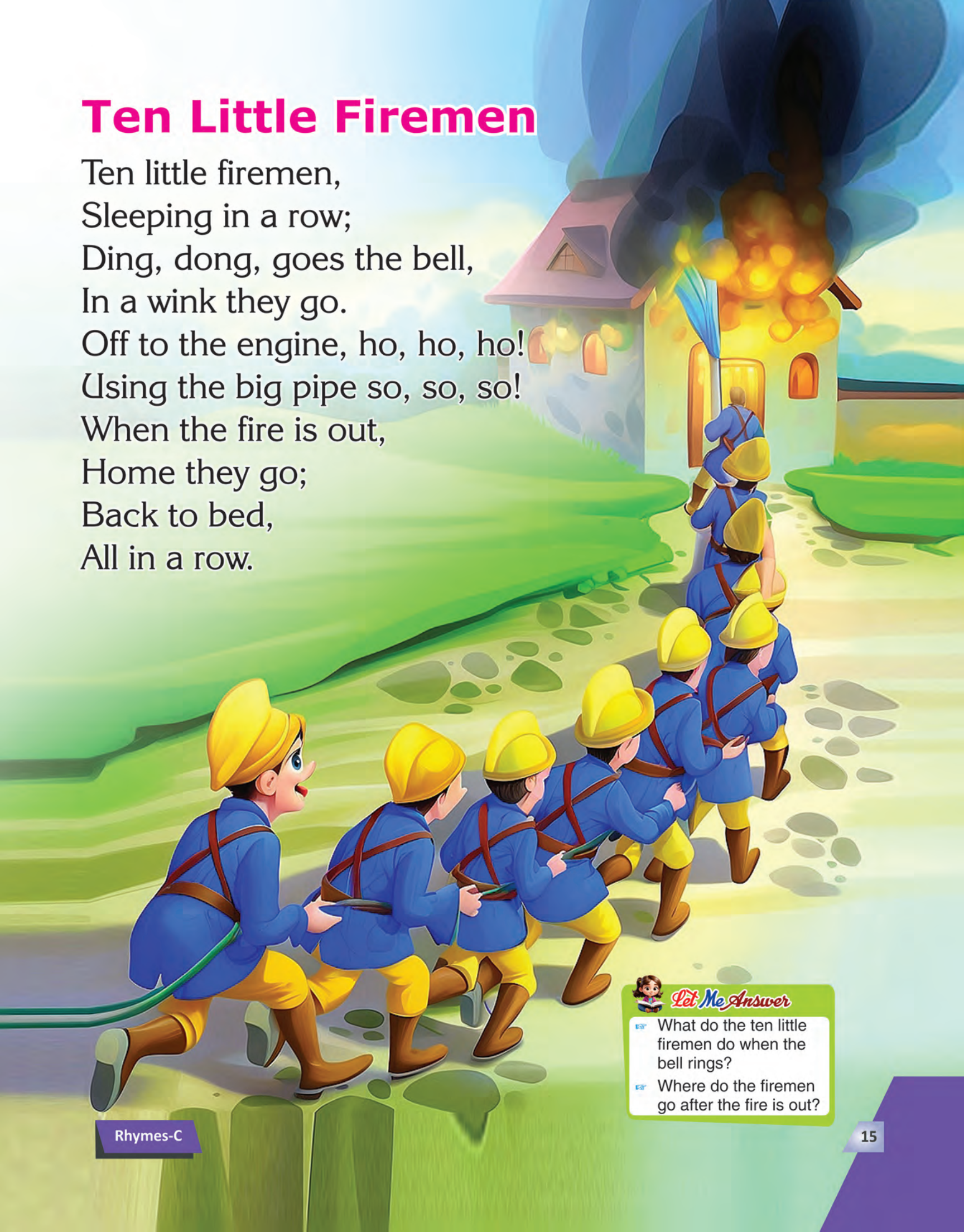

clown's about.

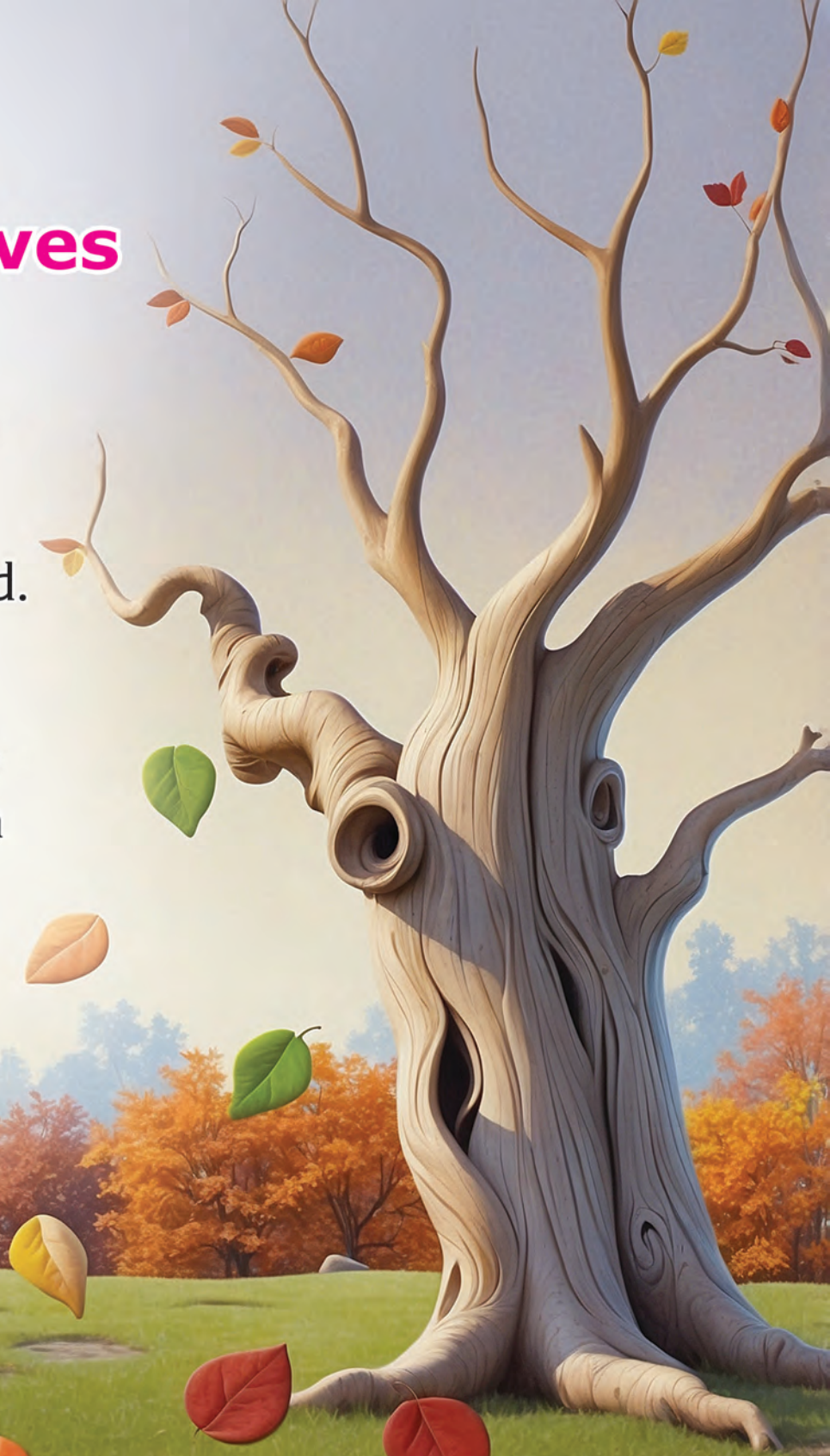
